Kalkaska teachers started the year off with a special presentation from one of the nation's leading experts on the adverse effects of childhood trauma, Dr. James Henry. Dr. Henry is one of the co-founders of the Childhood Trauma Assessment Center located on the campus of Western Michigan University.

Dr. Henry presented to the KPS staff on September 1 from 8 a.m. to 12 noon. He covered a great amount of information about childhood

trauma, secondary effects of trauma, and what we as educators can do to help all students become successful. In addition to a PowerPoint presentation, Dr. Henry included interactive segments, asked for volunteers to role play, and spent time in the afternoon during a Q&A session to help everyone grow.

Cherry Street Upcoming Events




